This book was available to you on reserve at Helen C. White and you did not realize that you had not purchased it with your other books earlier in the semester. You shared that about 1 AM you moved from a table to a more comfortable place to sit, and based on the policy body worn camera, it appears you pushed two reading chairs together to form a space to lie down. You acknowledged that you were told by library staff not to fall asleep after they observed lying on the chairs and not awake. You stated that you had [REDACTED] At approximately 5:47 AM you were contacted by police who appeared to wake you up when they first made contact with you, indicating that you had fallen asleep again. While the officer did ask [REDACTED] in the body worn camera footage, as you spoke and walked, I do not find that the evidence supports finding you responsible for camping in the library--it is evident that you were not intending to sleep and yet still overcome by slumber. However, you were directed to leave rather than sleep in the library and failed to do so before the police contact. I am issuing a written reprimand to assert that it is your responsibility to follow reasonable requests of university staff and while you were hoping to read the book on reserve, it is evident that you were not likely to successfully complete the text and perhaps not even retain the information before your class, without sleeping.

Warning Letter	During our meeting, you explained your housing situation. You explained that you have two roommates who present challenges to your living conditions. You elaborated that you cannot really sleep in your room due to one roommate's sleeping/jarring habits, and you cannot really sleep in the shared space based on the other roommate's habits. Furthermore, you explained that there isn't anything you can do to work with either roommate to resolve these issues at this time. You described that you are frequently able to sleep at your girlfriend's apartment but do occasionally have evenings where you are unable to sleep at her place and end up sleeping outside. You shared that this problem will go away soon, and acknowledged the resources I sent you. When we discussed the particular time you were sleeping in Alumni Park and stopped by the police, you explained that you were initially confused but had a conversation with the officer about the public urination. We also talked about what grounds are considered University lands and thus covered under the camping policy. As we discussed, I do believe that you technically made mistakes in his instance based on the wording of the policy, and I am concerned about the housing challenges you experienced this semester. However, I do not think it is appropriate to find you responsible for violating either of the charged policies because your choices were limited at the time. After our conversation and the resources I shared, I do believe that you are better aware of what behaviors are allowed or not allowed on campus, and future behavior of this kind may result in a finding that you are responsible for violating these policies.

Found not responsible	During our meeting, you explained that you were not sleeping in the ██████████ building on 8/9/2022. You said you were working with your roommate on a floor above in the building, and your roommate left but you stayed to keep working. You explained that you had emailed your friend a question around the time the officer spoke to you, and you rested your eyes after sending the question. You said you turned the lights out because they were otherwise shining in your eyes when you leaned your head back. You showed me that your sleep tracker app showed no record of sleep on the evening 8/8 into 8/9 (when this incident occurred) until around 5 in the morning. You said the officer came in while the lights were off and assumed you were sleeping. I confirmed with a Disen in the ██████████ that you were allowed to be in the building after hours to do your work, and I reviewed the previous incidents you've had related to being in the building after hours. The first incident reported involved you sleeping in the building, but you said you hadn't known that was against the rules and stopped doing so once you were aware. You also explained that you were able to find a consistent residence after that first incident. The second incident involved you only being in the building after hours. You explained that you were allowed to be in the building but didn't know how to communicate that with the officer at the time. In the current case, your account of what happened is plausible. There is a discrepancy between your account and the police log entry which includes a note that you had "personal property" with you while you were in the office. At this time, I have not been able to gather any information clarifying what the property was, but you said you only have your laptop and school supplies. You also said that you used to bring clothes when you slept in the building but had not brought a change of clothes or other non-school-related personal property to the building since learning it was not allowed to sleep in the building. Based on the information available to me, I am dismissing the charges against you. I find it more likely than not that you were working on 8/9/2022 and were only resting your eyes while waiting on an email response when the officer found you. Nevertheless, it is important that you use UW building space safely and appropriately as you continue your time as a student at UW. While it is appropriate to work in spaces like the ██████████ building after hours, you are responsible for managing your time in a way that avoids the risk of you falling asleep while you work--what I understand to have been a possibility in this case since you were working at 1AM on 8/9/2022. Future behavior of this kind may result in disciplinary action.
